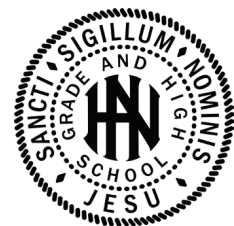

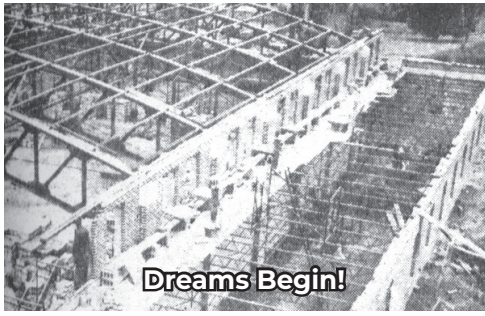

Anticipated Outcome | Impact to the Community

With the renovation and new construction the Restore the Glory Campaign will:

- Provide a **safe environment** for all users of the facilities.
- Greatly expand the **sports opportunities** for the community at-large.
- Allow the community at-large to have access to the **multi-use spaces**.
- Serve quality Out-of-School Time learning opportunities to **250 Students daily**.
- Facilitate the Out-of-School Time program implementing the use of **The Technology and Media Enhanced Experiences (TAMEE)** program. TAMEE can be implemented as either a virtual or in person Out-of-School Time program.

PROJECT BUDGET

Phase I Renovation & Construction

Renovation of the Field House	\$ 1,120,000
Construction of a Community Center/Connector	\$1,674,000
Site Preparation & Contingency	\$ 576,000
Total budget to complete Phase I	\$3,370,000

Phase II Programming & Maintenance

Provides continuous maintenance for the Field House and Community Center spaces and the implementation of a year-round quality Out-of-School Time (Afterschool) Program for elementary, middle, and high school students, with emphasis on Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM) learning opportunities.

Programming	\$ 630,000
Invested Reserve Fund	\$ 1,000,000
Total budget to complete Phase II	\$ 1,630,000

* A newly-developed *Solar Project* would provide renewable energy for both the new and existing structures.
