

In 1996, many parishioners, alumni, school families and friends joined together to launch the first five year \$750,000 Capital Campaign. In 2002, a Master Plan defining the immediate, deferrable and long term needs of this community was developed and in June 2003 the first phase of the new \$1,000,000 campaign began. The campaigns have been successful and the benefit to the campus facilities immeasurable.

In June of 2006 with faith and confidence the community redefined goals and kicked off the second phase for the next three years of this campaign with a monetary goal of \$750,000. Once again, holding to our strong belief in stewardship of your gifts we have completed much of the work under the three goal areas of the 2006 campaign with total donations of almost \$300,000.

In year three we will report on all of the completed projects, and talk of expansion of the work under the goal areas. We have been so blessed by volunteers, in kind donations and your contributions that we have surpassed what we originally set out to accomplish. Completed Projects

Main entrance to the school: Replaced front steps, stone architecture and installed metal railings.

Updated and installed new electrical wiring throughout the school building.

Installed window air conditioners in each classroom.

Installed new Fire Alarm system in the school.

School building and Field house: Capped off underground boiler steam pipes and ran new pipes above ground.

Moved main entrance of the Rectory from the east side to the southwest end adding a ramp for handicap accessibility.

Five classrooms: Installed dropped ceilings, lights; new paint, new carpet.

Rerouted the water drainage off of the church, school and field house buildings.

New asphalt and striping for the entire parking area of the campus.

To Be Completed

Install diagonal parking with handicap accessibility on the south side of church. (In progress). Install a Keyless Entry system for all entrances to the school building and field house. (In progress) Renovate the east side of the Rectory.

Replace remaining old windows in the school building.

Generous gift to Holy Name from the "King of Condiments" by Tom LaHood



"Merrill Kill, in name only." This was Merrill's response when introduced to a new acquaintance. Merrill, even though approaching 100 years, was as sharp as the knives he used as a meat cutter for over fifty years. Merrill was a native of Maryville, Missouri and entered the United States Army February 6, 1942.

While home on leave in July 1943 he married Theresa. Sergeant Kill ended his army career October 24, 1945, after serving in The European Campaign. Upon his return from the war the job opportunities in Maryville were limited. The couple traveled west to New Mexico where Merrill was the cook, attendant and manager of a restaurant - fuel stop at Gallup on Route 66.

New Mexico did not suit the newly married couple for long. They returned to Maryville and then moved to Omaha where Merrill took up the meat cutting profession. He worked at his trade for several grocery outlets in the Omaha area, retiring in the late 1970's.

Theresa and Merrill purchased a home at 6623 Curtis Street in Omaha and joined the Holy Name Community in the early 1960s. He loved sports, especially, golf and bowling and was very competitive in both. In his mid-nineties he played in organized leagues of both sports. The Holy Name Frydays of Lent were his favorite Lenten activity. He was the "King of Condiments". The individual containers filled with sauces for the fish were never empty when Merrill was on duty.

Merrill died February 26, 2007 at the age of 97. He and Theresa remembered the Holy Name Community in their wills with a gift of \$150,000. Their legacy has helped Holy Name continue its' work of educating the young and nurturing the members of our community. The Kill's generosity helped pave the way for the future. Literally, some of the funds were used to resurface our parking lot. Merrill was a very practical man and would have approved of this expenditure. Thank you Merrill and Theresa.

To help you remember just how long Holy Name has supported this novena, here is a little history from the 1957 Dedication of the Church document. "While all the material development of Holy Name Parish was taking place during these early years, the spiritual growth of the parish kept abreast. Masses were crowded so that more had to be added each year; the Sacraments were frequented, and the devotions to Our Mother of Perpetual Help were taking root in the very heart of the parish since the first Solemn Novena, November 1918. From all over the city the clients of our Blessed Mother came to worship at Her Perpetual Help Shrine in Holy Name Parish. More services had to be added to accommodate them until other parishes began their own devotions.

Family Fund Scholarship Recipients

Family Fund Scholarships began in 1996

In November of 1996 the Charles and Madeline LaHood Scholarship was created by their children, Charles H40, Mae LaHood Borshiem H42 and Tom H55. The first Charles and Madeline LaHood Scholarship was awarded in May 1997. Since that time this fund has generated thirty-five scholarships to Holy Name students.

One of the newest funds to generate a scholarship is the Servants of Mary Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship was awarded for the first time this past May.

Family Funds are held within the Education Endowment. A fund begins generating a scholarship when it reaches a \$2.500 principle balance and has accrued interest for one year. There are currently thirty-four Family Fund Scholarships.

SCHOOL NEWS



I wish all of you could have seen the faces of parents and children as they walked into the primary classrooms on the first day of school. Over the summer these five rooms had an "extreme makeover...school edition". Ceilings were lowered; a fresh coat of paint applied to the walls; new light fixtures installed; and beautiful blue and gold carpet was laid. These rooms were last "made-over" when the current church was built in 1958 and this space was converted into class

rooms from the original church! We are grateful to the donor who provided the seed money to complete this renovation and to the three seminarians who helped Andy Horst, plant manager, get the job done. Holy Name is so blessed to have such generous and talented individuals as part of the "family".

There are other things to celebrate. Our enrollment increased by 15 students.....25 kindergarten students arrived the first day and all of them were still here on the fourth day! There are thirty-eight 7th and 8th grade leaders who will assist the faculty in passing along the traditions of our school to the younger students.

Providing a safe learning environment for all staff and students is a primary concern in every educational facility. Within the next few weeks Holy Name will incorporate a keyless entry system for the school building and field house. With the brand new asphalt playground area completed this summer, children will be safer as they run playing games at recess. This project also included an improved drainage system which moves water away from the buildings.

At a recent gathering all of the faculty and staff introduced themselves and shared their total years in education. We have such a wonderful group of young educators mixing with veterans. The average longevity at Holy Name is 10 years with an overall average teaching experience of 25 years! This level of expertise punctuates the quality of the learning experience our students receive. Again, we are blessed to have these dedicated adults surrounding the children everyday.

We love to share our day with visitors...please plan a time to come and see for yourself what exciting things happen in the Holy Name classrooms everyday. God bless each of you and your families.



In Frank

In the thirty years I have served in the Archdiocese I have had several conversations with priests who had the task of starting a new parish in the Omaha area. As they worked to build all the needed parish and school buildings in a new and booming neighborhood, each one had moments when they said something like; 'wouldn't it be nice if we could just move the amazing church and/or

school structures from east Omaha out west?' They were looking at Holy Name's buildings.

As I listen to the news reports of shootings and other violence in north Omaha I know why these buildings are important to leave right here. Even though these structures are not perfect and have needed some repairs from fifty plus years of hard use, they serve a very important role in providing what this area needs; strength, security and community.

When families here are dealing with gunfire outside their homes they need a big solid church to attend that will lift their spirit and help them feel the strength of God. When the children are feeling insecure, they need a school that is built like Fort Knox to make them feel safe. When the young people in our neighborhood are tempted to get into trouble they need a parish community to embrace them. When peoples' lives seem to be out of control, they need a place like Holy Name to turn to. Thanks to the grace of

God, the love of Mary, and you, His people, this parish and school provide so many things that have been and will continue to be exactly what is needed.

This summer Holy Name provided a home for three seminarians who worked fulltime at the parish. Each of them mentioned many times how wonderful it was to be here. They found that they gained tremendous insights into themselves as they participated in the work of this parish. They learned new skills, like how to drop a ceiling in a classroom. They tested their abilities by leading Communion Services. They learned what it meant to put in a hard days work when they were digging out tree stumps. They learned that no matter how smart they are they would never have all the answers, like when they ran the Vacation Bible School. Because of what they gained here this summer, they have promised to pray for the parish throughout the year. Because of what they gave to the parish we need to pray for them also.
