PARISH NEWS



Holy Name is reaching out to more people every day! In the last issue of the Rambler I gave you some background information concerning the closing of St. Richard Parish and School. Since then we have moved several steps forward. The rectory is now being rented out to help pay the bills for the facilities which have been turned over to Holy Name by the Archdiocese. The St. Vincent de Paul Society has moved their Omaha headquarters into the office area and the Notre Dame Sisters are moving some of the members of their order into the second floor living quarters while their convent is being remodeled. As of today I am still in discussions with a few other groups interested in using the school building. There are several good options that are looking positive for the future. In the meantime the Cafeteria/Social Hall is being used almost every week by the Sudanese community, which helps them out and provides some extra income. The seminarians that worked at Holy Name this summer helped out at the St. Richard facilities by starting the process of converting the Church into the new social hall. All in all the work is progressing very nicely.

Our main campus renovations are also moving along very nicely. We have been working so hard for the last five years to update these aging facilities and so much has been completed. The school has some new restrooms, new wiring, a new fire alarm and security system, a new heat delivery system, and many remodeled classrooms. The church has an elevator, a new tile floor in the cafeteria and now the church and

cafeteria have new air-conditioning. Plus we have the refinished parking lot with new and safer handicapped parking on the south side of the church. Thanks to the Men's Club the cafeteria should have a new ceiling put in over Christmas vacation. It is amazing how much work has been done. Some of it by volunteers, some by our maintenance staff with the help of seminarians and some by contractors, but all of it happened because of you, our generous donors. I am overwhelmed by the great response from so many of you in regard to the extension year of the current Capital Campaign. You truly are the heart of Holy Name! Thank you! We will continue to steward your gifts in the best ways possible so that new goals can be reached.

Through prayer and because of the blessings that come from God, we have been able to do so many good things for this neighborhood. The mission of Holy Name is so important to North Omaha. We must continue to pray for miracles. There have been so many miracles at Holy Name it gives me confidence that we will experience even greater miracles in the future.

All of the goals plus additional renovations were completed with the exception of the windows on the east and north sides of the school building.
