



A Tribute to Sr. M. Adolorata Watson, OSM

June 2, 1915 - June 4, 2010



Sister served us so generously for many years at Holy Name. Here is an excerpt from her eulogy, As we bury Sister, she joins these women of God, as one who in her lifetime was a woman of promise and hope and who lived and shared the Good News. She touched so many lives through her teaching and writing.

Margaret Christine Watson was born on June 2, 1915. She was the fourth of six children born to Frederick G. Watson and Evangeline Shapter

Watson in Madison, NJ. In her writings, Sister speaks very lovingly of her family, and that love was marred only by their deaths, some at a relatively young age. Margaret attended elementary and high school in Madison, and then went on to the College of St. Elizabeth. After college and in the aftermath of the Great Depression, Margaret found employment in a number of businesses from Standard Statistics Company in New York to operating the key punch machine for computer cards. She finally landed a wonderful position as secretary to the Headmaster of a boys' Prep School in Lakewood, NJ. As much as she liked this work Margaret felt God was calling her to something else. In response to this call, Margaret entered the Servants of Mary in August of 1941 and was eventually given the name Sr. Mary Adolorata.

Sister began teaching in 1943 at Holy Name in Omaha, NE. Through 1975 she taught in Colorado, Iowa, Michigan and again at Holy Name. Her career also included being assigned as principal at both Holy Name and Marian High School.

Please enjoy this poem written by Sister one New Year's Day as she sat looking out the window at our cemetery, in part it reads:

"In the distance I see the cemetery where lie mortal remains of our Sisters,
Servants of Mary...
...Some I had known in life,
others lived before my time,
all came toward me,
incredibly free...
young, full of hope, of promise,
God's women all
who lived and shared the Good News
to a world willing to hear."

UNO ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME INCLUDES HOLY NAMERS!

Anyone attending an athletic event at the University of Nebraska-Omaha will notice the rows and rows of pictures of UNO athletes and coaches that grace the upper areas of the rotunda forming the entrance to the university's field house. Included in the Hall are figures such as "Rocket Roger Sayers," brother of all-time NFL great, Gale Sayers, and one of the few sprinters to ever beat Bob Hayes, the Olympian and world's fastest human in his era, and "Marlin the Magician Briscoe," the NFL all-pro wide receiver and first black athlete to ever start as quarterback in NFL history. Among these athletes recognized for their achievements and contributions to UNO sports are two individuals with direct ties to Holy Name School: Bob Gates H44 and Ruth Evans H85 O'Callaghan. A third UNO Hall member, Cindy Rudloff Lebeda, also has ties to Holy Name as the daughter of HN great Howard Rudloff H50. Cindy is married to former Holy Name teacher and coach, Jim Lebeda.

Bob Gates was inducted into the UNO Hall in 2003 for his contributions to the Mavericks baseball team. He directed the Maverick program from 1976 to 1999 as head coach and won 476 games, including two conference and regional championships. Coach Gates also was inducted into the Nebraska High School Hall of Fame for his coaching success at Holy Name, which included six state championships in football, basketball, and baseball. At Holy Name, Bob was an All-State basketball player and led his team to the state tournament in his senior year. (Interestingly, en route to the district championship, HN had to defeat a ranked Schuyler team, whose star player was none other than long-time rival Cathedral coach, Roger Higgins!)

Bob attended the University of Nebraska in Lincoln, but his career was interrupted by the war and he finished college in 1950. He lettered on the Cornhusker basketball team of 1949-50, which tied for the Big Seven championship. Returning to HN as an assistant coach, Bob was part of the staff during the Holy Name 39-game undefeated football streak that set a state record. With the untimely death of legendary HN Coach "Box" Engelbretson in 1954, Bob took over the HN reigns in all three major sports. His first football and basketball teams in 1955 were undefeated. Championships were added in basketball in 1957 and 1958 and in baseball (all-class) in 1952 and 1953. Bob left HN in 1961 to pursue a college coaching career at UNL as an assistant in basketball and baseball. In 1966,

Bob took over the coaching and athletic director duties at fledgling Pershing College in Beatrice, where he directed both the basketball and the baseball programs. When the college closed, Bob returned to UNL and eventually migrated to UNO, where he assisted, then inherited, the UNO baseball program where he remained for 23 years until his retirement. (He was followed by Bob Herold, a member of the combined 1960s Holy Name/Cathedral summer Legion teams).

These days Bob can be found playing golf on the UNO faculty and staff league at Elmwood Park and at DJs Dugout Sports

Bar on 114th St every Wednesday at 11:00 a.m., where a number of alumni, former Rambler athletes, and friends of Holy Name congregate!

Ruth Evans H85 was inducted into the UNO Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997 for her accomplishments as a three-time NCAA All-American on the volleyball court. She had "honorable mention" status for All-State in basketball, but blossomed into a dominating volleyball outside hitter in college. Ruth played for the Mavericks volleyball program from 1985 through 1989, during which time she led the Mays to a144–30 record. Her UNO teams won three North Central Conference championships and finished third in NCAA Division II three consecutive times. Ruth was the 1988 UNO Female Athlete of the Year and was also on the NCC conference's all-academic team. Her most memorable match was a four-hour marathon victory over the powerful University of Nebraska volleyball team, which later that year won the NCAA National Championship with a nearly unblemished record with a single loss—to the UNO Mavericks.

Ruth majored in Recreation Therapy at UNO and worked for Immanuel Hospital prior to starting her own child care business. These days she can be found with her husband, Charlie O'Callaghan H81, a State Trooper in their home near Blair. Ruth's daughter, Sara, is a 6'2" junior hitter for Millard North and has accepted a scholarship offer to play for Nebraska after being recruited by several Division I volleyball programs. Unlike her mother, Sara's talent is being recognized in high school, as she was recently named to the Class A All-State team.

After 35 years, Janet remains a master teacher who brings the love and desire for learning into her classroom everyday. An obvious mutual respect and rapport between teacher and student is fostered through her constant care and concern for each child's ability to learn. Janet challenges her students to reach their highest potential and constantly motivates with prompts, encouragement and support to see that this potential is reached. Students say "Mrs. Sauter is hard!" Janet gratefully accepts this compliment!

Janet has been a constant at Holy Name through many transitions of programming and administrators. Yet, there is a constant theme that is expressed:

- •"Your classroom is inviting, cheerful, and speaks of the importance of learning."
- "Janet encourages and supports children in their efforts to learn because she cares that they learn."
- "She fosters a secure environment that allows for interaction, questioning and successful learning

We have much to celebrate...One hundred percent of our twenty-one 2006 eighth grade class graduated from high school in May! One was the valedictorian of her class, many earned college scholarships and high scores on ACT and SAT tests. Their high schools certainly deserve some credit for these accomplishments but these students received the basic foundations of their education right here at Holy Name. We share in the pride of their accomplishments and wish them many more success stories as they enter the next phases of their education.

The 2010 eighth grade graduates earned academic and/or leadership scholarships to Roncalli, Prep, Mercy and Marian. Seventeen of these twenty-one graduates are planning to attend a Catholic High School! The traditions of excellence continue at Holy Name.

During her tenure at Holy Name Janet has been recognized by CH.A.D.D. (Children and Adults with Attention Deficit Disorders) for her dedication to helping children adjust to classroom expectations and be successful. In 2000 she earned recognition as the "Metro Archdiocesan Elementary Teacher of the Year" by the Archdiocese of Omaha School Board. In 2006 she was recognized as a "Distinguished Graduate" from St. Pius/St. Leo School Elementary School

Holy Name Catholic Elementary School held an all-day health fair for students, families, and the Holy Name community. During the morning, students traveled to the different booths learning about seat belt safety, healthy eating, exercise (including yoga),

safety in all areas of their life and some techniques for stress management. Students from Roncalli High School, Creighton University School of Nursing, and Creighton University School of Pharmacy and Health Professions guided Holy Name student groups through the booths. 

Since 1996 this community has been successful through Capital Campaigns in continuing to maintain and renovate many areas of our campus. The completion of the 2006-2009 campaign followed by the extension year 2009-2010 has been very successful and great work has been completed.

We are honored and humbled by the total amount donated toward our efforts from 2006 through June of 2010. Phase II and the extension year provided \$395,577 in donations toward our efforts. Thank You!

The following is a list of the **Completed Projects** to date:

Main entrance school front steps, stone architecture and installed railings.

Updated and installed new electrical wiring throughout the school building

Installed new fire alarm system in the school building

Installed window air conditioners in each classroom

Installed keyless entry system for all entrances to the school and field house

School building and Field House: Capped off underground boiler steam pipes; ran new pipes above ground Moved main entrance of the Rectory from the east side to the southwest end adding a ramp for accessibility

Five classrooms renovated: Dropped ceilings, lights, fresh paint and new carpet

Rerouted the water drainage off of the church, school and field house buildings

New asphalt and striping for the entire parking area of the campus

Install diagonal parking with handicap accessibility on the south side of church.

Replaced the air conditioning system in the church

Renovated east side of Rectory (In Progress)

We are currently getting ready to kick off the 2010-2013 campaign. Leadership for the campaign is being developed as well as the goals for the work to be completed. To date we have identified the following projects for next three year campaign. For the school building: tuck pointing \$114,000; update all lighting \$28,500; replace windows \$242,000. For the church building: tuck pointing \$77,250; update electrical-bid out; landscape south side-bid out. For the rectory building: tuck pointing \$6,380; update electrical-bid out.
