The mission of Holy Name Catholic Elementary School is to educate children of diverse backgrounds to be academically prepared, compassionate toward others and rooted in the Catholic Christian Community

From the Principal

As an accredited school in the State of Nebraska, Holy Name School is required to engage in 5 year cycles of continuous improvement. Goals are determined at the beginning of each cycle and then the process of developing action plans and activities to accomplish those goals are put into place. The process is culminated with a visit from an external team of evaluators. We have just completed this round of 5 years. I want to share some of the process and results with you.

Math problem solving and school climate were our target areas of study. Each of the teachers was involved in one of the target area committees. But, every teacher was responsible for implementing the action plans developed for each study area. Over the 5 years many new ideas and activities were developed and put into practice.

A new math program was introduced requiring new lesson plans and instructional processes. Strategies for consistency and common practices were shared. We watched our math computation scores on ITBS standardized testing closely. Teachers gave pre and post

tests each semester and recorded scores. Math meetings were held at the beginning of each daily lesson. Repetition, drill and timed tests became a regular part of the math routine. As a result we saw our math computation scores increase significantly.

School Climate involved two distinct directions of study...one to highlight and celebrate our diverse student population and the second to improve student-student relationships. Once again teachers were called on to be creative and "think out-of-the-box" to provide activities and programs that encouraged harmonious relationships throughout the student body. Artists in residence from Korea, Japan and Benin, Africa were engaged using grant funding. Formal programming to assist with positive peer interactions were scheduled. Teachers taught regular lessons focused on building respect and cooperation. Student surveys indicated a strong improvement in self-confidence and self-respect.

All of this was accomplished in the midst of regular school programming and curriculum. We have been busy! So, did we accomplish our goals.....did we meet the criteria.....did we pass the test for renewed accreditation? The initial summary report was overflowing with compliments about our achievements. Our visitors were positively overwhelmed as they questioned parents and board members. But, the group that impressed them the most was our students! These young people shared personal pride in their school and expressed thankfulness for the efforts teachers make on their behalf. Yes, our visitors were impressed and we are now ready to begin a new 5 year cycle of efforts to get even better! Pray for us as we continue to do the Lord's work at Holy Name School.

One of the city's priority areas is serving Omaha's youth and ensuring they have the support and skills necessary to be successful today and in the future. Lemonade Day provided youth with an opportunity to work with a caring adult to develop a business while learning valuable life and job skills.

Class of 1967 Richard Brown Talks About Life and Career

Richard Brown H67 has lived a life most of us only see on television. As a former agent of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, Brown has been a part of many high-profile investigations. "During my 30 years with ATF I was involved with arson and bombing investigations, illegal firearms trafficking cases, organized crime syndicates and even a couple of "moonshine" investigations. Many people may not realize it, but ATF was originally established during the prohibition era with Elliot Ness considered to be the forefather of the current day Special Agent. Thinking back on all the investigations I worked on throughout my career, the most memorable one was that of an outlaw motorcycle gang that had committed murders, bombings, assaults and a myriad of other vicious offenses. It was extremely rewarding to be able to take several members of this violent gang off the streets. The investigation had all the makings of a Hollywood thriller and I hope someday they

would actually make a movie about it, with my character being played by Brad Pitt."

After graduation from UNO with a degree in law enforcement and corrections, Brown was hired by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco & Firearms in 1972 and was sent to Madison, Wisconsin as his first post of duty. He remained there until 1975 then transferred to Minneapolis/St. Paul where he spent the majority of his career, except for three years at the ATF headquarters near Washington, D.C.

However, despite taking down some hardened criminals, Brown credits his education at Holy Name and the firm foundation of faith he established as a student for getting him through life. He also developed many lifelong friendships with many of his classmates with whom he is still in touch. "My faith has been tested in both my personal and professional life and without it I would have been lost." Brown also states that the lay teachers and nuns at Holy Name reinforced the

belief in helping others less fortunate. When asked what he would say to his teachers from high school he replied, "Thank you, any accomplishments I may have gotten throughout my life started with a good quality education based in faith and they are responsible for that."

Currently living in Coon Rapids, Minnesota with his wife Bev, Brown is the proud parent of two very successful children. Sara who is on the faculty at MIT and lives in the Boston area and Andy who is married and lives in St. Paul where he and his wife Lisa both work for a non-profit social work agency. Although he retired from ATF in 2002, he still continues to work in the law enforcement field as a firearms analyst for ATF and a firearms instructor for the Federal Air Marshals. His advice for current Holy Name students is "dream big and work hard towards those dreams. You are the next generation of scientists, teachers, police officers and doctors."

Hetherington Named Omaha Heart Ball Princess



Hannah Hetherington, granddaugher of Carol H59 and Ernest Pfannenstiel, lives with a diagnosis many like her never have to hear. The 2011 Omaha Heart Ball Princess's congenital heart defect is the leading cause of sudden death in athletes. When Hannah began playing basketball in grade school, her parents Jack and Ann, noticed she

was easily winded and took her to the doctor. She was diagnosed with sports-induced asthma and continued to play basketball. At times, her lips would turn blue and her parents and coaches would encourage frequent breaks and use of her inhaler. During extreme episodes, Hannah would head to an urgent care facility for a breathing treatment.

At one of those emergency visits, the doctor on call questioned Hannah's original asthma diagnosis and gave her an electrocardiogram to check her hearts' electrical activity. As suspected, the results were abnormal and she was referred to her family physician to follow up. Soon, Cardiologist Dr. Christopher Erickson at Children's Hospital and Medical Center was brought in and made the life-changing diagnosis. The then Millard North freshman was diagnosed with a hypertrophic cardiomyapathy. The next day Hannah had a heart catherization, MRI

and a stress test. One week later, Hannah received an implantable cardioverter defibrillator, known as an ICD. More than one year later, Hannah makes it her mission to educate her peers about CPR and heart disease, and to raise money for cardiovascular research breakthroughs. Doctors say Hannah's heart disease has progressed some, but with medication, plenty of rest and proper exercise she is doing well and is optimistic.

Since the publishing of The American Heart Association article, Carol Pfannenstiel has updated Holy Name with the following information from Hannah's parents, Ann and John "As a result of Hannah's latest visit to her Cardiac physician, we found ourselves at the UN Med Center this morning visiting with several doctors, nurses, and counselors. We visited with Dr. Ioana Dumitru, a transplant cardiologist, and Dr. John Um, a transplant surgeon, to begin Hannah's evaluation process which will hopefully lead us into gaining a spot on the transplant 'list'. Her latest check up revealed a dramatic change in her heart function since her last check up six months ago. Specifically, it appears Hannah's heart is functioning at only 12%. The way it was explained to us was if her heart was functioning at 50%, we could probably get another year out of her heart with the help of meds, but 12% isn't going cut it."

Thank you to your many prayers, Hannah received a heart transplant on May 2. Please continue to keep Hannah and her family in your prayers.

- •The Development Office mails the solicitation letters.
- •After the letters are sent, the Gift Acquisition volunteers contact the businesses by phone to remind them of the request and facilitate the donation process. In some cases, the donors respond promptly; in other cases, additional calls are needed. Gift Acquisition Team Leaders maintain contact with Gift Acquisition volunteers to ensure the process is going smoothly.
- •The Development Office staff assist as requested by sending out additional letters or by arranging to pick up donations.


Overview of Campaign Work 1996-2010

Holy Name has run a successful capital campaign for campus building maintenance and renewal since 1996. Over these past fourteen years, our benefactors have given more than \$1,936,954.00 toward our goals.

- (1996–2001) Total gifts: \$893,000. Completed goals: replaced the roof on the church and gymnasium; repaired the roof on the school and rectory; upgraded teacher's salaries and benefits; installed a staffed technology lab; and refurbished specific areas of the cafeteria.
- (2003–2006) Total gifts: \$565,000. Completed goals: renovated two of the grade school restrooms, including handicapped accessibility and upgraded plumbing; renovated the women's and men's restrooms in the cafeteria, including handicapped accessibility; installed an elevator in the church; and replaced the school main entrance steps and stone architecture including installation of railings.
- (2006–2009) Total gifts: \$384,607.00. Completed goals: installed diagonal parking with handicapped accessibility on the south side of the church; updated and installed new electrical wiring throughout the school building; installed new fire alarm systems in the school building and field house; installed window air conditioners in all classrooms; installed keyless entry system for entrances to the school building and the field house; capped off underground boiler steam pipes and ran new pipes above ground in the school and field house; moved main entrance of the rectory from the east side to the southwest end, adding a ramp for accessibility; renovated five classrooms with new drop ceilings, lights, fresh paint, and new carpet; installed drop ceilings and new lights in the primary grades hallway; rerouted the water drainage off the church, school and field house with an underground system; and installed new asphalt and striping for the entire parking area of the campus.
- (2009–2010 Extension Year) Gifts to date: \$94,347.00. Completed goals: Replaced air conditioning system in the church; installed new floor and new ceiling in the cafeteria; replaced the doors on the north side of the church and the west and south side of the field house; renovated the east side (old main entrance) of the Rectory; and erected a permanent school sign at the (west) main entrance of the school building.

A bell tower has a symbolic meaning for church beyond calling people to worship. The traditional designs of churches were to show that the church was the ark of safety amidst the chaos that surrounds us in this word. The image of the boat is to be upside down to show that the ark is to bring us safely to heaven rather than glide along the sea of sin. The power source and steering of the boat is the rudder and motor. This is represented by the bell tower, but the image is only complete if there is a cross on the steeple. This shows us that Christ is our rudder or the way, and He is the power that we depend on to get us to heaven.

If you have ideas, significant artifacts or are interested in helping to fund this project, please let me know. This should be a perfect finishing touch to the church that many of you helped to build along with the architect, Carl P. Stangel, my great uncle and your fellow parishioner back then.

As we welcome our alumni back, see our 8th grade graduates move on and look to our centennial we have a lot to celebrate and be thankful for. These things happen because of you: our friends, parishioners and alumni. Thank you!


