Holy Name School Currently Enrolling Students

Holy Name School, located at 2901 Fontenelle Blvd in Omaha, is currently enrolling children in preschool and pre-kindergarten classes. Holy Name offers pre-kindergarten classes Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning and afternoon. Children must be 4 by October 15th to enroll in pre-kindergarten classes. Preschool classes are held Monday and Wednesday mornings. Children must be 3 by October 15th to enroll. Holy Name School also offers childcare from 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday through Friday.

Holy Name School prides itself on a strong curriculum that allows children in preschool and pre-kindergarten to be fully prepared to enter the kindergarten classroom ready to learn. Preschool classes learn listening and social skills, as well as how to properly share time, space people and things, colors, shapes and number recognition. Pre-kindergarten classes focus on literacy skills, oral language and letter identification, number awareness and computer instruction.

Holy Name School also has openings for students wanting to enroll in grades K-8. High school graduation rates for Holy Name students are at a consistent 98% and many enter college with honors.

Regina Lee, Holy Name School parent, comments "my children have all gone through Holy Name preschool and pre-kindergarten classes and are now enrolled in the school. I can honestly say that by enrolling my children in preschool and pre-kindergarten classes helped them to excel to the level they are at now. I highly recommend Holy Name School. Students Meet Holocaust Survivor

On Friday April 15, the Holy Name seventh and eighth graders met Holocaust survivor, Bea Karp as a conclusion to units on the Holocaust. They had read books such as Anne Frank's Diary and Hana's Suitcase as well as Daniel's Story, a novel published by the US Holocaust Museum. Bea spoke about growing up in Germany in the 1930s as an Orthodox Jew and living through Kristallnacht, the Night of Broken Glass, as well as being sent to a concentration camp and losing both her parents. She was transferred to France and was eventually able to hide out in a convent, pretending to be Catholic until the end of the war. Bea amazed the students with her adventures and her courage. While in the camp, she kicked a Gestapo officer and lived, as well as throwing rocks at Nazis when she was still in the Jewish ghetto. When asked why she survived, she said it was part luck, part optimism and part mental toughness as well as her faith.

Holy Name Provides Free Breakfast and Lunch to Thousands

Holy Name Catholic Community is pleased to host the US Department of Agriculture Food and Nutrition Summer Feeding Program for the fourteenth year in a row. Cafeteria Manager Eileen Rasnick and her team provide breakfast and lunch to children under the age of 18 Monday through Friday. Rasnick states that they provide over 600 meals a day. "It is a lot of work, but it is worth it. These meals are often the only meals these kids will get

during the day. We provide them the opportunity to eat a healthy meal in a safe environment." Last year Holy Name provided over 30,000 meals during the summer feeding program. The program began on May 31st and will run until August 12th. Breakfast is served from 8:30-9:30a.m. and Lunch is held from 11:30-12:30p.m The program is free for individuals 18 and under.

Gary Smith Class of 1971 Reminisces about Holy Name

What is your favorite memory of Holy Name School? The comraderie and the school spirit. Junior year in high school was memorable. We were upper classmen but didn't have to act mature like the seniors. What part of the education you received at Holy Name do you contribute to your personal and professional success in life? To respect others and treat each person - no matter how popular, powerful or poor - as you would like to be treated.

After graduation, did you continue on to post secondary education... What career path did you take...have you done since graduating from Holy Name? I continued my education at the University of Nebraska, graduating from UNO with a Bachelors in Journalism. I parlayed that into a position at Mutual of Omaha writing job descriptions and later convinced the HR Director at St. Joe's Hospital that I had relevant skills for a job in Human Resources. With that experience, Northern Natural Gas gave me a shot in 1981 and the next 30 years have

been spent in the energy industry with stops in Omaha, Des Moines and Houston. Pam and I have been married for 32 years and we have four children (three boys, one girl) and two grandchildren.

In your family life after high school (college) – did your learning experiences at Holy Name play a role in your choice of spouse, marriage, in raising your children? Each time we moved and settled in, we always looked for Catholic schools where the kids could get an education with a moral base and enjoy an atmosphere of inclusion like Holy Name provided.

Who was your favorite Holy Name grade/high school teacher? Favorite grade school lay teacher was Mr. Bianchi. "Mr. B" taught us in eighth grade with a sense of humor and an appreciation for the challenges of adolescence. Favorite grade school religious teacher was Sister Damian. She wins because she had to put up with me twice - in third and fifth grade. Also, I broke a couple of her rulers with my knuckles so I owe her. Favorite high school lay teacher was Mr. Krainak, Journalism and English teacher and advisor for the Flambeau and the yearbook. He was patient and encouraging but also expected performance. Favorite religious teacher in high school is a tie between Sister Mary Cecile, who taught music and had the good sense to tell Jack Ferry and I before Sophmore year that the Glee Club would be fine without us, and Sister Mary Ann who taught freshman religion with the patience and demeanor of a saint.

If you could go back and tell your Holy Name teachers one thing what would it be? Thanks for letting us have fun while learning, not only what was in the book, but how to get along with one another.

What is your advice to current Holy Name students? Enjoy and treat your classmates well. You are blessed to have caring teachers and a community that supports you and your school. Respect the Holy Name tradition and do the best you can every day to carry it on.

What is your hope for Holy Name School? That it will continue to provide a quality education and a nurturing environment for its students. That it will be supported by its alumni so it can thrive. A Note from Father Frank



Summer is different at Holy Name this year. For the past five years the main summer guests at the IHOPS (International House of Priests and Seminarians) have been seminarians. This year it is priests. Fr. John Zotoglo has been with us for about a year now. He was studying the English language until this summer, but now he is spending his summer studying Spirituality at Creighton University. He will be here for another two years for that purpose. His bishop in Togo, West Africa, is getting him ready to work in their seminary.

A month ago Fr. Raphael Okitafumba was able to spend a couple weeks at Holy Name. He was the seminarian who stayed with us for a year as he finished his M.Div. at Creighton at the request of his bishop in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. He was in the U.S. to do mission appeals for his diocese.

A few weeks ago Fr. Vitalis Anyanike moved into Holy Name. He is from Nigeria but was ordained for our Archdiocese in 2003. He just finished his pastorate in Hooper and Scribner and

has now been assigned a pastor of St. Benedict the Moor and St. Therese of the Child Jesus. He is living at Holy Name because he is working with Fr. John and me to put together a group of young men who will work in the inner-city of Omaha to help the poor. These Ad Gentes Missionaries will be forming their community at Holy Name. The Archbishop has given his approval for this endeavor and has made it workable by assigning Fr. Vitalis in North Omaha. Our hope it to extend the work of the Catholic Church in Omaha.

The other side benefit of this increase of priests at Holy Name it that it gives me the chance to take the Sabbatical that I have been trying to set up for the last few years. The Archbishop has approved me to attend the Sabbatical program at the Pontifical North American College in Rome. I will be gone from Sept. 11 until Nov. 23. Stay tuned to the Holy Name web-site this fall to receive more information on this adventure of mine.

Father Baumert: Reflections on Vietnam



Last month I had my second experience of being a part of a medical missionary trip to Vietnam. My first one was two years ago. That time I accompanied four dentists, a doctor, a pharmacist, and a half dozen helpers that organized and helped these dentists and doctors do their work. I performed two functions. With a simple eye-chart I ascertained the type of reading glasses needed for about 400 people. Besides doing this basic optometry work I was also there to bless and pray for the people for many of them needed far more than we could offer, but their faith was strong and I tried to let them know that it wasn't just our group that was trying to help them. I wanted them to know God was still looking out for them.

This year the team was bigger with three dentists, five doctors and over twenty on the support staff. We even had a specialist to teach health and hygiene classes. I was still

doing the prayer for the people but one doctor was an eye specialist so I was moved to weights and measurements. I found out how much they weighed and how tall they were so we could try and track their progress next year.

On the Vietnamese side the trips were set up by the parish priests in the remote villages. On the American side they were organized by a teacher who grew up in Vietnam and came to the U.S. as a refugee. He is setting this up to help the people who don't have the blessings he has found in the U.S.A.

My personal guide on these trips has been Dr. Frank Evans, a dentist who grew up in Holy Name. He has been on over twenty-five missionary trips. He and I have been

working together to finance two of the Nuns we met over there trained as a doctor and a nurse so they can continue to do this work year round instead of a few weeks per year. Many of these people have never seen a dentist and seldom can afford a doctor so we know the needs these Sisters are trying to meet. It has been a great experience that I recommend to
