Students recite a prayer before the dinner meal and this year one of our third graders gave a testimonial! Yes, I said third grade! She already knows the importance of her education at Holy Name School, and she spoke with such eloquence! The game is made up of twelve questions from various subject areas including religion, geography, history and social studies. No one is allowed to use their Smart phones;

participants must rely on the knowledge they have gained through their education and experience.

This event has raised more than \$120,000 for the school, due in large part to the members of the Advisory committee inviting others into our mission. Once others hear about our

Fun in the Snow at Fontenelle Forest





Endow Excellence!

Holy Name Education Endowment Family Fund Scholarship Program

Since 1997, the Family Fund Scholarship program has offered individuals and families an opportunity to support the education of a student currently enrolled in grades two through seven at Holy Name School. Today there are 46 funds held within the endowment. Total gifts to the endowment: \$438,500.

The scholarship can be named for parents, a family member, an individual or a specific group. To start a fund a principal gift of \$2,500 is made to the endowment. Many times this gift is made after the death of a loved one when there have been significant memorials directed to Holy Name to remember this person. On other occasions an individual, family or group desire a named scholarship to support the mission of the school for years to come. 

<u> A Note from </u>Father Frank

For almost a year the Meitler Consultants, hired by the Archdiocese, have been working to draw up a strategic plan for the Catholic parishes and schools east of 72nd Street in Omaha. This round of work is almost finished. The proposals suggested for Holy Name Parish and School are very interesting and should help us to be our best for years to come. The proposal for the school is that a Foundation of third party donors be set up to garner funds to support three schools serving the poorest and the most diverse neighborhoods in Omaha; Sacred Heart, All Saints and Holy Name. Each of these is considered a "mission" school because it does not just serve parishioners as our parish schools have done for over a hundred years. This funding group has taken on a daunting task. This group will be working in conjunction with the existing funding operations of each of these schools. For Holy Name that means that you will still be hearing from Colleen

Peterson. She has been a big part of making this possible. Her skills as Director of Development at Holy Name will be critical for the future of the parish and school. Beyond that, the school will continue doing the great things for which it has always been known.

For Holy Name Parish the proposals delve into several areas. First, we will be adding a Mass on Sunday, and it will be in Spanish. St. Therese of the Child Jesus Parish is the current parish providing this Mass. The proposal is that Holy Name will become the hub for Catholic Hispanic Ministry in North Omaha. With the availability of a school, large social hall, a large church to grow into, etc.. this seems to be a much better fit.

The second suggestion is for the parish, and it proposes that we share a pastor with St. Benedict the Moor. As most of you know they have been the African-American parish in Omaha. Holy Name has already been working with St. Benedict and St. Therese for several years. We have been a part of each other's Vacation Bible School and Confirmation programs. Sharing a pastor with St. Benedict will be similar to the two years that I was pastor of St. Richard and Holy Name. Sharing resourses in this way saves money for each parish and brings new life to the programs being offered.

All of these changes will reinforce the work that the staff and I have been working on for several years; to reestablish Holy Name as the Catholic hub of North Omaha. One of the changes that comes with these proposals is a change of pastor. Fr. Vitalis Anyanike, whom we have worked with for the last year will become the pastor of Holy Name as of June 21st, 2012. He has been pastor of St. Benedict the Moor Parish and St. Therese of the Child Jesus for this past year. With these changes he will be pastor of St. Benedict the Moor and Holy Name. I will become the Administrator of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Parish which has been going through some major transitions as well. Please pray for the success of all of these plans.
