The Mission of Holy Name Catholic Elementary School

The mission of Holy Name Catholic Elementary School is to educate children of diverse backgrounds to be academically prepared, compassionate toward others and rooted in the Catholic Christian Community



We have just completed another Catholic Schools Week. During this week teachers and students celebrate the gift of a Catholic education at Holy Name. And we have much to celebrate. As our students prepare for and participate in the Geography Bee, Spelling Bee, Bible Bowl, math contests, and more...we are filled with pride. Knowing these students will compete against students from larger school populations does not diminish the enthusiasm, especially when we often win!!

Our school year theme "I Make a Difference" has been the calling card for the efforts and achievements for each child and faculty member. The "I" becomes a strong "We" everyday in our classrooms. This year's Catholic Schools Week theme supported our efforts. *Faith*, *Academics*, *Service*.......these words all sound very familiar to those around this campus.

FAITH: Woven throughout every curriculum area and embedded in the everyday experience is the importance of faith in our lives. Our faculty gathers each morning before school to pray the Memorare. Students pray before their day starts and at the beginning of every class period. Students all take turns performing as ministers at our weekly celebrations of the Mass. Stations of the Cross, the Living Rosary, May Crowning, Benediction and other traditional devotions are taught and practiced. Common prayers and those not so common are taught as part of the religion curriculum. All children participate in the sacrament of Reconciliation three times each year. Even our children from other faith experiences receive Father's blessing as they promise to avoid making the same mistakes again! Infusion of faith is the most important part of an education at Holy Name. We feel obligated to tell the stories of Jesus for the children may not hear these stories anywhere else.

ACADEMICS: A challenging curriculum prepares our students to be successful beyond their years at Holy Name. Interviews with our graduates conducted throughout their high school years indicate they feel well prepared. Many of our graduates receive Catholic high school scholarships and achieve honor roll status while taking advanced level courses. We provide opportunities to succeed that are promoted by dedicated teachers and support systems that expect excellence.

SERVICE: Our 7th and 8th grade students are required to perform at least nine hours of service each semester. Students serve dinner at the Open Door Mission, play board and card games with residents at the Salvation Army Durham Manor, spend time in our Humble Jumble Thrift Store and of course help at the Fish Frys. Many share their time independently with other community organizations. All Holy Name students participate in the Pennies for Patients and St. Vincent dePaul Pantry collections. Service is provided throughout the school day as seasonal projects dealing with parish activities take place. *Holy Name students all know the meaning and value of service when they leave our school. They recognize that "in giving we receive...."*

It is our hope that all we do today is a testimony to the rich traditions we have inherited from previous alumni and teachers of this school. It is our plan to continue teaching each successive generation the importance of faith, the value of a quality education and the personal benefits of giving back through service to others. Rose Mary Burkland and George Burkland moved to Holy Name parish with

their parents in 1956. Before the interstate came through they were Holy Angel parishioners. Though neither attended Holy Name School, they have remained in the parish because of the people and the "feeling" of Holy Name. George has been here 37 years as he has moved a few times. Rose Mary has spent the last 56 years here, still living close by.

Today, George and Rose Mary are dedicated volunteers for Holy Name and the St. Vincent dePaul Society. Most notably, they are responsible for the bulk of the food pantry deliveries. As a nominator stated, "They go about the food delivery quietly, daily and without complaining." George estimates the pantry serves about 600 area families annually. Rose Mary also volunteers for the Giving Tree. This year, Holy Name's Giving Tree was able to help 23 needy families.

running late, the teachers could set their clocks by his tardiness. In high school, he played every sport offered: basketball, football, track, and baseball in the summer. He was also involved in student government, serving three of his four high school years as Class President. Gary participated in the student newspaper and the yearbook. He had a very influential teacher who whet his whistle for journalism, which became his career field. After high school, he attended UNL to study journalism. A desire to play football led Gary to transfer to UNO as a "walk on." He broke his hand the first year he played but says, "it was no big loss to them." He currently resides in Houston, Texas, but his mother and a son live in Omaha, giving him plenty of reasons to come back to town. When he does, he still spends time with his Holy Name classmates. He acknowledges what a close community it is and gives generously to Holy Name. With a family spread out across the country, Gary spends much of his free time traveling with his wife, Pam, visiting their four children and two grandchildren.



Rosemary Holeman has been a member of the parish for 60 years. She attended grade

school and high school at Holy Name graduating in 1957. She played on a girls' basketball team funded by Clairmont Pharmacy at a time when there were no women's sports. He graduated from Holy Name High School in 1979 and followed his love of cooking at the Culinary Arts School of Omaha. In 1988, Tom became a member of Holy Name Housing Corporation's rehab crew, and after ten years, he was

hired as the Housing Coordinator. Tom took great pride in his job at Holy Name, but his biggest passion was his family. He enjoyed spending time with them at Lake Okoboji and on an annual deer hunt with his brothers. Tom remained close to his classmates too. Every year, members of the Class of 1979 gathered for a fishing trip. Tom was well known for his sense of humor. He liked to speak to the elementary students on Career Day. He would always tell them that he was not the best student and should have applied himself to learning in school. He would explain how he grew up in Holy Name Parish, went to Holy Name

School, graduated from Holy Name High School, and now he works at Holy Name Housing. Then he would tell them that his office was right upstairs, located in one of his old classrooms. So, he'd say, "you better study hard, or you'll never get out of here. You'll be stuck at Holy Name in a classroom forever, just like me!"

Holy Name High School Class of 1939

In 1939, five girls walked across the stage together with diplomas in hand, graduating from Holy Name High School. Seventy-four years later, those five women still gather as friends to share the stories of their lives and their memories of Holy Name School. They have had regular reunions since Mary Catherine Hegarty organized their 50th in 1989. Their most recent was their 70th in 2009. Mary O'Brien Baines, Ann Mullaney Cope, Mary Catherine Dannehy Hegarty, Margaret Mary Stratman MacMartin and Gertrude Ramm McAndrew are lifelong friends. Recently, they allowed Holy Name to interview them for an article. After the first paragraph, it became apparent that the article would not be easy one to write. This group of friends has three Mary's! Last names are used liberally in this article to avoid confusion.

After high school, they all married and went to work during World War II. MacMartin worked for the FBI, and Baines worked for the War Department while the others were successful in Omaha business offices. Only one has moved away from Omaha. MacMartin now lives in Los Angeles, but she remembers a good, religious upbringing at Holy Name that she passed on to her children. Hegarty and McAndrew both stayed in the neighborhood and sent their children to Holy Name School. Currently, McAndrew has a great granddaughter at the school. Baines and Cope both reside in other Omaha neighborhoods.

Taking some time to reminisce, the ladies remember favorite teachers, Mother Frances, Sr. Perpetua, Mother Loyola, and Sr. Liguorie. Hegarty and McAndrew shared a love of basketball in high school, but Baines remembers not being able participate in activities during her school years because of a twenty one block walk to and from Holy Name. They have vivid memories of their times at Holy Name School, including Mr. Engelbretson who came to the school in 1937. He was the first man and layperson to be hired as a teacher and a coach. MacMartin remembers how the principal, Mother Frances, would let her take the bus downtown to make bank deposits and run other errands, and Cope's best memory is of the wonderful friends she's made. One thing they can all agree on is the Class of 1939 has held a very special place in their hearts for the last 74 years.

My second honeymoon is definitely over! In the last Rambler I was leaving to go on sabbatical in Rome. I find myself back in full speed with the excitement that is typical in the Holy Name Rectory. Many of you have heard that the Archbishop hired the Meitler Consultant Group to lead a process and develop a strategic plan for the parishes and schools east of 72nd street. The process has been a rollercoaster ride. The Meitler proposal in the third round draft document stated that Holy Name School and even the parish might close. Shortly thereafter Mr. Pete Ricketts and the other members of the Holy Name Advisory Committee released through the press their intention to start a community foundation to shore up the financial shortfall that the school has faced in the past few years. The Meitler Consultants strategic plan is still a couple months away from being finalized and will be submitted to the Archbishop for review in April. Your voice and many others have been heard in response to these draft recommendations and

we remain confident that there will be changes in the next round of recommendations. Everyone needs to be aware that even though we will stay open there could be some significant changes in regard to collaborations with other parishes and/or schools in order to serve this area of Omaha. One possible scenario has Holy Name becoming the home for a growing Catholic Hispanic population in North Omaha. We would not become a "Hispanic" parish; we would simply become more diverse than we are today and this could be very exciting.

One of the positive effects of the Meitler Consultants study is that everyone in this part of town has had to do real self-examination about what is important to us for our parishes and our schools. This kind of self examination brings out the best of the work that is carried out through Holy Name Parish and School. We provide so many great services to this area and we truly are an anchor for North Omaha. We should be very proud. The goal of any parish or school should always be to achieve excellence. We have an excellent school that does wonders for so many children. Our parish shines as a model of tremendous diversity coming together to be one in Christ. We are what we should be, the extended family of God.
