Planning for the future is sometimes a matter of dreaming for all we would like to see happen. It can also be a process of building on what is the present, studying trends and then making an educated guess about what will happen next.

I would like to think that at Holy Name we are forward thinkers who use a combination of both strategies to make things happen. It was no secret that our school enrollment needed to grow. It was no secret that our image needed reenergizing throughout the city and with our out-of-state alumni and friends. At the same time within a year there was the potential of welcoming Hispanic families to our parish community.

The decision to hire someone for Marketing and Recruitment became a clear necessity. This decision brought significant results as the registration phase for the 2013-2014

school year began. New branding and logo, regular correspondence with potential families, follow-up communication with all inquiries and proactive planning have all rendered positive results. I anticipate a waiting list for several classrooms based on paid registrations received thus far.

The enrollment and welcome of Hispanic families to our parish community brings the potential of additional children ready to fill our classrooms. The planning for recruitment efforts to embrace these families and encourage enrollment in our school promoted the hiring of a Spanish language teacher. Bringing Spanish classes to our current students provides them with additional language experience as they enter their selected high schools. It also provides a facilitator as Hispanic families begin to inquire about our school. School forms and interviews will require translation and a translator.

Once again, Holy Name School finds itself in a position of hopeful transition. With adequate planning we are moving forward from a position of strength. I invite you to join with us as we dream and build a strong foundation to support the future of our school.

I ask that you keep our students and their families in your prayers as we send them home for the summer months. I want everyone to return safely in the fall. May God's blessings be with you and your families.

Marketing & Recruitment Update

Nine months ago, I became the Marketing and Recruiting Director for Holy Name School. The first step was getting to know the students' families and demographics. The Holy Name student population is incredibly diverse with students located in 18 different zip codes. This diversity is a hallmark of our school. The following months were spent on several projects that will be built on in the coming summer months.

- In an attempt to stay in touch with our alums who are now in high school, a mini reunion was planned, and almost thirty students attended! Thanks to a donor, eight of these students were invited to attend the Holy Name Hall of Fame dinner as representatives of our younger alumni group.
- With the help of a volunteer graphic designer, we are working to rebrand our Holy Name image. The new spiral blue and gold image will be consistent through all of our new marketing efforts.
- During the famous Lenten Fish Fry's the tunnel leading

to the cafeteria was decorated in professionally printed posters, student artwork, pictures of the children and newspaper articles highlighting activities involving our students.

- A mailing of 5,000 postcards was sent out to the community for our Kindergarten Round-up and two Open Houses this spring. As a result this year's Kindergarten Round-up doubled the number from previous years. The Open Houses have helped to enroll ten new students to the Childcare and preschool programs.
- Holy Name yard signs have been placed around Omaha. The yard signs will be placed in yards once again during July, so if you would like one, please contact us. Also, keep your eyes open for a billboard on the corner of Fontenelle and Saddle Creek starting in June.

All of these Marketing efforts have worked to improve the recruitment efforts. The teachers, staff, and administration at Holy Name make a great team. Together we have already surpassed the number of new enrollments from last year, and it is only May! Help bring new life to Holy Name. Excellence... A Note from Father Vitalis



A Note from Father Mike

I entered the Redemptorists out of eighth grade in 1961. When I was ordained, I never considered that I would return to Holy Name as a priest. I wanted to be a missionary. Even though I have never gone on a foreign mission, for the past 22 years I have been immersed in Hispanic ministry. My work has rarely been parish based in those years. I ran a youth house for inner city youth in Denver for five years. For six years I preached parish missions in English and Spanish, and formed a community of lay volunteers to broaden the scope of the traditional Redemptorist mission.

I participated in the Redemptorist Hispanic Initiative in Southwest Kansas for six years. For 13 summers I ran programs for migrant children and youth in The Dalles, Oregon. The last four years I have been the director for "Campesino" ministry, that is farm worker ministry for the Diocese of Fresno.

Through those years I walked with migrants and immigrants, especially from Latin America. I fell in love with the faith, the traditions, and the hopes and struggles of migrants. I developed programs for migrants, but most of all I experienced what Redemptorists define as the source of our mission. The poor have evangelized me. I receive far more than I ever may give as the migrant has formed my experience of being called to be a priest.

As Holy Name welcomes migrants and immigrants from all over the world, I look forward to welcoming our Hispanic community and have great confidence that the community of Holy Name is at the beginning of something very much needed in our Church universal. Along with Father Vitalis, I look forward to discovering the blessings of truly forming one community of many cultures, languages and histories. To migrants and immigrants, I wish to say, "You will never find a better place to call home than Holy Name."

I look forward to reuniting with friends and alumni of Holy Name. It is great to be home once again. May God bless us in this endeavor!
