Holy Name School has a long standing track record of success with our students. A little over five years ago we began looking at what we will need to do to carry this legacy on for another hundred years. Twenty first century business models and practices look very different than they did over the past century. By taking a strategic look at our future we have determined that we need to shift into a twenty first century model.

Over the past ten years or so you have generously supported the “Annual Appeal”. This appeal was initiated to generate funds to support the operating needs of the school. Operating needs encompass many aspects of operating Holy Name School. The annual appeal funds support educational programming materials, faculty salaries, student tuition assistance and much more. Eighty percent of the Holy Name School annual operating budget is achieved through charitable donations. Your support is crucial to sustaining the mission of the school. The development department is responsible for forty nine percent of the operating budget. In reviewing our past success through the Annual Appeal we have determined that this fund raising activity needs to broaden. We must move way from an appeal and move in to building sustainable funding.



Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year the annual appeal will become a year round giving opportunity. By building on the platform of the annual appeal we renew our vigor for continuing the mission of the school for years to come. The goal for the Holy Name School Annual Fund for this year is \$362,000. A committee is being created and many generous supporters have been asked to join with us to achieve the goal. These constituents believe in our mission and have generously provided their time and talent to move this effort forward.

The Contributions of the Class of 1947

Earlier this year, Holy Name received an update from the 1947 Class President, Jeri Ann Kelly. At the time, she was known as Geraldine Cogan. Jeri Ann contacted the school about donating a copy of the 1947 Yearbook, “The Spires.” The school did not have a copy, so everyone was happy to receive it! After speaking with Jeri Ann and looking through the archives, it is evident that the Class of 1947 made many contributions to Holy Name School.

The Class of 1947 initiated the first yearbook at Holy Name School. With the support of Mother Liguori and Sister Adolorata, Father Ray Schmitt gave his complete support of the project. Upon receiving his copy he realized that the students were able to fund it through the sales of magazines and advertisements in the yearbook. The annual yearbook a tradition that still exists at Holy Name School.

Another great tradition that started with the Class of 1947 was the crowning of a Homecoming King and Queen. That first year it was King Phil Novak and Queen Rosetta Hubbard. The Prom King and Queen, Bob Elworth and Colleen Gentleman, were also a highlight!

The Class’s most recent get together was their 60th High School reunion during the 2007 Alumni Weekend. They have remained a close knit group and many of them keep in contact. Thank you to Jeri Ann and the Class of 1947 for these traditions and for providing an important missing piece of Holy Name School history!

Education Endowment Family Funds: Butalla

In 1998 Holy Name implemented a program within the Education Endowment called "Family Funds". This program gives donors the opportunity to "name" a fund within the endowment with a gift of \$2,500 or more. Since the inception of this program your response has been incredible! There are now 47 active funds and in May of 2014 there will be 52 active funds. The benefits for our students with these gifts are immeasurable. Each of the family funds provides a scholarship for one student for the following fiscal year. The Holy Name school students and their families are so grateful for this support. They want their children at Holy Name School because they know that in this school their children are safe and they will be successful. As well as providing the scholarships, gifts directed to the family fund program have added more than \$500,000 to the education endowment to secure the future of the school.

This year, one of our current family fund donors, brothers Barth H59 and Dick H61 Butalla, are starting a second fund to memorialize the lives of their sisters Mary Rita and Helen Ann. All four of the Butalla children are graduates of Holy Name High School though Barth was only at the high school for his senior year. Their parents Frank and Rita Butalla were pillars of the parish for forty years. †Mary Butalla King H65 and †Helen Ann Butalla Ross H68 spent many wonderful years being active at Holy Name School. Both of them became educators. Mary and Helen were involved in many activities during high school. They exuded great energy and leadership and each was elected to Prom royalty.

Mary graduated from Holy Name High School in 1965. (*Cantata 3,4; Spring Musical 3, 4; Tri-M 3, 4; Choir 3, 4; Music Contest 3, 4; CYO Basketball 1; Pep Club 1, 2, 3, 4; Library Staff 3; Sodality 1, 2, 3, 4; Sodality Officer 1; Theresians 2, 3, 4; JRC 1*). After high school graduation Mary was married and had two children. She went back to school to pursue a teaching degree and accomplished this goal in the early 1980's. Over the next twenty eight years Mary accomplished many milestones with her teaching degree. Her accolades began in 1986 with the Outstanding Teacher Award from the AAUW, NSAB, NPTA and the Omaha World Herald. She received the PTA Honorary State Life Membership award in 1989. In 1991 she was chosen for the coveted Buffett Award. Once again in 1996 she received a certificate of honor from the Omaha World Herald. After twenty eight years of teaching at Joslyn Elementary School her career culminated with retirement recognition from Omaha Public Schools in 2011.



Through her work and her children she leaves a great legacy to her five grandchildren.



Helen was also a leader at Holy Name High School, graduating in 1968. (*Sodality 1, 2, 3, 4; Theresians 1; Pep Club 1, 2, 3, 4; Upper Classman Rep 3, 4; School Play 1, 2, 3, 4; Cantata 3; Red Cross 3; Pacemaker 4; Flambeau 3; National Honor Society 2, 3, 4; Secretary 4; Prom Royalty 4*). She was involved in numerous activities and worked for the greater good of many through her efforts while involved in the Red Cross, Sodality and in her senior year as an office assistant to Principal, Sr. Mary Adolorata. She was an officer of the National Honor Society and one of many who played a journalist role in the production of the newsletter, the Pacemaker. From Holy Name High she went

on to college at the University of Nebraska Omaha graduating with her teaching degree in 1972. She followed her path of serving others and taught home economics at the high school level at the Winnebago Indian Reservation in northeast Nebraska. Helen Ann served the Winnebago community for almost ten years. During this time she was married and had two children. A diagnosis of Multiple Sclerosis brought her back to family in Omaha. She departed this earth much too soon in January of 1986. Today, Helen's two boys and her grandchild live in Wyoming.

Barth and Dick have chosen to memorialize the lives of Mary and Helen by starting a family fund to continue the tradition of providing an excellent education to students who will one day leave Holy Name School and take leadership positions all over the world. These two women exemplify the impact that an excellent education can have on a student. Thank you to Barth and Dick for their generous continued support of the mission of Holy Name School.

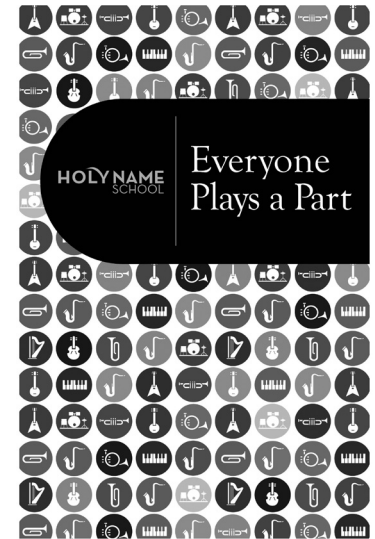

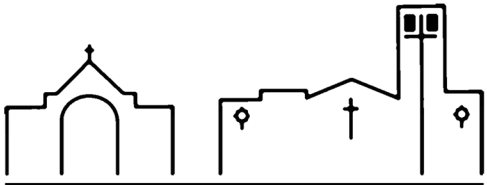
