

Our first permanent school building was erected in 1923. Over time, in order to serve increasing numbers of families, new wings were added to the north and east of the original two story structure.

Planning for the first capital campaign for the buildings on the campus began in 1996. The campaign kicked off in 2002 and ran continuously until 2013. This same year, the Archdiocese of Omaha began a study of the parish and school buildings around

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Holy Name Families and Friends,

In the last Rambler, I stated that my hope was to extenuate and build on the spiritual and academic successes of the past while carrying on a vision of growth and a renewal of our school's academics and facilities for the future. One of the many characteristics our parents and community value is our constant effort to be better tomorrow than we are today. Our high expectations will drive our plans to address the present and future needs of each child at Holy Name School.



Therefore, we have hired a 2nd/3rd grade combination classroom teacher to address the academic and emotional needs of each child in the second and third grade classrooms. Those two classrooms currently have a total of 45 students! **Our 2015-2016 enrollment is over 200 children for the first time in over 12 years!** Our plan is to have two classrooms for the kindergarten, first, second, third, and fourth grades next year. Our faculty continues professional development activities with the other two **CUES** schools. This semester we are for focusing on differentiated instruction for each learner and an alignment process to enhance our curriculum from grade to grade with a focus on reading. Teachers will learn how to utilize data assessment to drive curriculum while continuing the focus on a personal relationship with each child. We are proud to announce the growth of our "*Makers Workshop*" after-school program. Due to the amazing grant writing skills of our technology teacher, **Karen Smolinski**, and the **CUES** grant writer, **Nicole Zickefoose**, the "*Makers Workshop*" area is now a **STEM** (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) lab.

The lab is stocked with **\$25,000** worth of equipment including robotics, classroom sets of circuitry toolsets, architectural design kits, woodworking, sewing and arts and crafts activities. Generous grants from *Cox Communications*, the *Simon Foundation*, *Ritonya Buscher*, *Shopko*, the *Goldenrod Foundation*, *PayPal* and private donors, we will have a fully functioning **STEM** lab in January. At that time, in addition to the after-school program, the **STEM** activities will be included in math, science and technology lessons in the classrooms.

Our technology program has taken a huge step forward with much more to come second semester.

Due to the financial support of our Men's Club, all of the classrooms presently being used, along with the five additional classrooms for next year, now have a new white board and a projector hanging from the ceiling. The teachers are thrilled with this new equipment as well as the addition of up to date desk top computers in the computer lab. Thank you! It truly does take a village!

Holy Name is very blessed to have the support of so many individuals and corporations. At Holy Name School every season has a reason to be thankful. I wish each of your families the joy of this Christmas season.

Our Servite Roots

Our first Redemptorist Pastor, Fr. Louis McKeown, C.Ss.R. was committed to continuing the vision of a parochial school system in the United States, believing that a parish becomes a growing, living entity only if it has an active school. In order to open and maintain a school, Holy Name Parish needed Sisters to teach the children. Fr. McKeown had already established a relationship with the Servants of Mary in Cherokee, Iowa.



After much conversation and urging by both Archbishop Harty and Fr. McKeown, the Servants of Mary moved to Holy Name Parish. Sister M. Columba Pitts, Superior, Sister M. Paula Callahan, teacher and Sister M. Genevieve Berabe, housekeeper, arrived on August 29th, 1918. Classes began on September 3rd, 1918.

Holy Name Housing Chief Retiring

Nonprofit has built hundreds of homes, helped countless homeowners

Omaha's inner city is lucky a Kansas City nun saw that bumper sticker. Sister Marilyn Ross had been looking for a job when the fateful message crossed into her lane: Holy Name neighborhood, a good place to live. Holy Name Housing Corporation was founded in 1982 by Holy Name parish priests the Revs. Don Neureuther and Jerry Mullen, and parishioner Ed Vaughan to address the area's deteriorating properties.

Sister Marilyn Ross joined as development director in 1983; becoming executive director five years later in 1988. About 700 homes in some of the most decaying neighborhoods have been built or rehabilitated through Holy Name Housing Corp., a nonprofit that is affiliated, but independent, of the church. Ross has worked there for all but one of its 33 years. Harder to quantify, but just as valued, supporters say, are results of housing-related programs Ross helped to launch, including homeownership and credit card management training.



Sister Marilyn Ross is retiring after 27 years as executive director of Holy

Name Housing.

Most recently, Holy Name Housing has partnered with Heartland Family
Service and others in the renovation of the former St. Richard's school
campus near 43rd and Fort Streets into multiple social-service
providers and 44 new cottages for low-income seniors. City Council
President Ben Gray, who represents north Omaha, called Ross a
stalwart whose team has visibly changed aging neighborhoods
and strengthened families. "That ripple effect —I don't know
you could put a price tag on it," he said. Ross credits her staff
of 12, the bulk of whom have been on the Holy Name team
more than 25 years.

At 76, Ross is retiring after 27 years as executive director.

She'll be succeeded by Michael Gawley, formerly a manager at a construction company. The nun intends to stay in Omaha with her Sisters of Mercy religious order and serve on governing boards and committees devoted also to social justice and poverty. The Holy Name Housing Corporation offices are now located at 4324 Fort Street.


