Thirteen years ago a pregnant Jackline Manyout and her husband Anthony Apayo left Sudan and arrived in Omaha, Nebraska. Their first son Apayo Apayo was born shortly after their arrival. Years later Apayo would be joined by his brother Will and his sister Ahok. The kids were enrolled at St. Richard's Catholic School before its closing. Holy Name was close to home and an easy transition for the Apayo children.

Anthony serves in the military as an Arabic Translator and has been stationed all over the United States: California, Texas, North Carolina and currently Arizona—and three trips to Iraq. He takes two weeks of leave twice a year to come home to Omaha to see his family. Why don't they move where Anthony is stationed? The reason is Jackline believes in her children's education and wants them to stay in one place to receive the best education possible. "My kids don't want to leave Holy Name because this is where their friends are, and they love their teachers. Holy Name and the teachers take great care of my kids," Jackline said.

Ahok is in fourth grade and loves to draw and read. Will is in the sixth grade and is obsessed with playing soccer, and Apayo is in the eighth grade and is a huge help to his mother around the house. Apayo recently scored in the top 15 of all students taking the Creighton Prep Entrance Exam. He was awarded the Presidential Scholarship and will attend Creighton Prep in the fall. Dear Holy Name Families and Friends,

It is the season of the school year filled with extra activities. We have just finished our celebration of Catholic Schools Week which included theme dress days, special treats, an all-school mass, letters to our military men and women, and of course, the infamous teacher vs. 8th grade volleyball game. The National Catholic Education Association set the overall theme of the week—Catholic Schools: Communities of Faith, Knowledge and Service. At Holy Name these qualities are part of the framework of all we do!

Students and teachers immediately move into a season of preparation for a variety of academic contests. The GeoBee, sponsored by the National Geographic Society, was held and a school winner determined. Our student representative moves forward to a state competition held at UNO in April. Our Advanced Literature students in grades 7 and 8 read the twelve books necessary to compete in the St. Vincent DePaul Book Bowl.

Students in grades 4 through 8 held classroom spelling bees to determine contestants for the school competition. Our winners will compete against other Catholic school winners in the Archdiocesan contest held in February. At the same time these students are preparing to compete in the Archdiocesan Math contest held in April. And then there is the Bible Bowl competition. Student teams are practicing in preparation for each competition. Our classrooms are productively busy before and after school!

Another program that has grown significantly is the "Makers Workshop". One night after school each week 30-40 students gather to "create and make" using scraps of lumber, fabric, yarn, etc. Some are taking apart and rebuilding old computers and other unusable electronics. Crochet, painting, and jewelry making can also be seen. Students enjoy the freedom of using the menagerie of leftovers to make something new!

Our students are eager and energetic. Our teachers are resourceful and dedicated. I am blessed to be able to watch the activity and offer encouragement to continue the good work! What better job could any Principal have!

Curt Simon

Curt Simon is a 1971 graduate of Holy Name School. He was active during his years at school and enjoyed acting and debate competitions as well as football (and earning various demerits). He appreciates his education and has many fond memories of teachers and classes, but the relationships he formed with his classmates have been the most memorable. He believes "the sense of community and belonging is life-long." His hope is to keep that sense of belonging alive. He considers it a gift he was fortunate enough to receive and would like to see continued for future generations. Curt is motivated by Holy Name School's current momentum and feels there is much more he can contribute.

Curt has emceed the Hall of Fame event for the past twelve years and

will happily serve on both sides of the podium this year. He also served on the Development Board and as the Chair of the annual Harvest event with his wife, Julie. He is active in the Omaha community serving as the Executive Director of Metro Transit. He has also been a member of the choir at St. Wenceslaus for twenty-five years.

A lifetime of friendships from Holy Name School has kept Curt close, and he will continue to support the excellent education and sense of community he has enjoyed through his childhood and beyond.



Clayton and Marie Carlson

Clayton and Marie Carlson moved to Holy Name Parish in 1954 and served as active parishioners and dedicated volunteers until their deaths. Clayton passed in 1980 and Marie in June of 2014.

Clayton was a member of the Men's Club throughout his time at Holy Name, including serving as President. He volunteered at bingo, served as Scout Master with Marie, and participated in many of his children's school activities. He also served as a Eucharistic Minister and usher for the Church and attended Mass almost daily.

Marie was well-known around Holy Name, actively participating in the Confraternity, serving at countless funeral lunches and assisting with bake sales. She volunteered at the Humble Jumble for twenty-five years and helped to clean and decorate the church. Marie was also a prime organizer of the Older Kids club. She participated in Bible study, served as a Eucharistic Minister, and ministered to the sick at home and in hospitals. For these reasons and many more, Marie was selected as Holy Name's Woman of the year in 1998.

Her children state that what was most important to their parents was to raise their children in a Catholic community. They were devoted to Holy Name and were dedicated to sending all eight of their children—Steven, Barbara, James, Patricia, Richard, Paul, Michael, and Mary—through Holy Name Elementary and High School. The Carlsons are outstanding examples of leading lives of faith and service.




Tim and Karen McElroy

Mike Clarke

Mike "Horace" Clarke graduated from Holy Name High School in 1970, but his involvement in Holy Name School has been extensive since his kindergarten year. Mike grew up five houses from the school in a neighborhood of over 150 kids. He laments that there were just as many mothers and it was impossible to get away with trouble "on the Boulevard." Since his graduation, he has stayed very close to Holy Name School in many capacities, including keeping very close relationships with his classmates. Horace has organized a golf tournament for the last 41 years, and three-quarters of the participants are Holy Name alumni.

As a volunteer, Mike has put in many hours wherever asked to lend a hand. He has served on the School Board, Advisory Board, and as Chair of Harvest with his wife, Melanie. Their children have followed along in their footsteps and have also made a commitment to volunteer their time

to Holy Name School. Kevin Clarke is the Marketing & Recruitment Director for the school. Kevin stated, "I never knew how much generosity my father had until I began working at Holy Name." The Clarkes have also generously supported the graduating 8th grade classes by sponsoring graduation gifts and assisted in bringing other young alumni back to Holy Name School events by sponsoring tickets for them to attend.

Mike attributes his continued support to the "commitment he sees from faculty, administrators, and development staff that are focused on keeping everything going." He feels a strong sense that the neighborhood needs an anchor and that Holy Name School is that presence.


