Having almost completed my first year at Holy Name School, I have learned that it is truly a special place! I feel blessed to be here! This place is much more than a school! Even though many of the Holy Name Alumni and donors are hundreds of miles away, they remain connected by their heartfelt compassion and drive for Holy Name.

This drive for excellence at Holy Name School is getting stronger as we announce the hiring of a second faculty member for kindergarten, first, second and third grade, and a primary resource position. These additional staff members provide the opportunity to prepare for our growth; we expect an increase of approximately 50 students next year. This will move the population from 215 to 265 students. We will maintain the lower teacher/student ratio. Our vision is to continue this growth each of the next five years while addressing the physical needs of the school building.

We have been blessed by the addition of projectors, personal computers for students and teachers in each classroom, a tech lab, and a STEM lab. We are grateful to the Men's Club and the multiple donors who have made this happen. This technology has helped us address many staff development opportunities which, in turn, address the needs of our students as we prepare them for high school.

Our 8th grade students have worked hard, and I am proud to say that on Tuesday, May 24th, they will be graduating. Thirteen of the fourteen are planning to attend local area Catholic High Schools.

From the students, staff, and parents at Holy Name School, I want to thank you from the bottom of my heart for what each of you have done over the years to make Holy

Name School a special place. I thank God every day for the opportunity to be your principal.

Celebrating STEM in Education




Congratulations to all the "angels" who received their First Communion at Holy Name. It was a very special Sunday for everyone!

What Holy Name means to me is that I have another place to call home. Everyone here always listens to what you have to say and doesn't just judge you. When I think of Holy Name




what comes to mind is friendship and family. You meet so many people and become really close. I would call Holy Name my second family. I will miss it very much.


