Holy Name School provides the education and skills needed for our students to be successful after graduation. The excitement and commitment continue as we open a STEM Lab (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) for our students. Over \$40,000 of equipment is available in the lab and has been funded entirely through grants and private donations. This new program addresses the need for students to participate in hands-on learning in STEM areas. To be successful, students require the skills of critical thinking, creative problem solving and teamwork to prepare them for future education in critical STEM areas and success in the workforce. The lab will open to the middle school students in February and fourth and fifth grade students in March. In the fall of 2016 these students will mentor the Kindergarten through third grade students, sharing their knowledge, which allows them to practice social and oral communication skills.

The robotics program provides eight robotic arms using joystick operation, four robotic arms using computer programming, three hydroelectric exploration centers and two cameras to use with the equipment. Also available are classroom sets of Snap Circuits, Snap Circuit Kits, bridge building kits, Lego Robotics, Little Bits electronic kits, wearable electronics and 14 Laptop computers.

Funding for this project came from four corporate donors and two foundations: Goldenrod, PayPal, COX, Shopko, Ritonya-Buscher-Poehling and the Simon Foundation. In addition, the Holy Name Men's Club, IFWINCO Blinds and several private donors and parishioners have donated equipment, furniture and additional funding.

Grants are pending for many exciting additions to the STEM Lab. Come by and check it out sometime; the students would love to show you all they have learned! Holy Name School is truly blessed to have the support of the community, and the students are very fortunate to have this learning experience!

Thank you to everyone who attended our Imagine event in February! The support you bring to our students through this wonderful event is outstanding. We extend our deepest gratitude to the St. Robert's community for their great generosity.

God continues to bless us with staff members who share the Holy Name spirit of making a difference for every child at Holy Name School. We welcome Becky (Bender) Galvan G01 to our teaching staff serving our 2-3 combination classroom and Mr. Jim Purnell as our Maintenance Director. Jim's father attended Holy Name High School. In addition to Jim, we have added two outstanding custodians, Cristian and Milady Benitez, son and wife of our lead Custodian Jonatan Benitez.

Our plans for the 2016-2017 school year include adding a second classroom to the following grades: Kindergarten, first, second and third. The plan is to decrease the student/teacher ratio as well as increase the quality of education with more attention to the needs of the primary children. This means hiring teachers for these rooms along with a full time resource teacher to address the needs of our primary students. Due to parent referrals, the outstanding work of our teachers and staff and the work of Mr. Clarke, our enrollment projection for 2016-17 is 275 students! Because of the amazing support of our Holy Name parents/guardians, donors, alumni, parishioners, community, our development program, and the passionate work of our school staff we are sure to succeed.

I want to close with a GREAT BIG thank you to Fr. Tom Fangman for all he has done as Pastor of Sacred Heart Parish and the CEO of CUES these last 18 years. Recently, he said Mass to begin a School of Faith training for all of the faculty for our CUES schools. His message was that our students and staff have access to God and that has and will always be the strength of our schools. This transition of faith cannot be measured or even assessed until we all join together in heaven in a special place Jesus has promised to prepare for each of us.






